follow-up letter. A professional letter written to your interviewers thanking them for the interview opportunity and expressing continued interest in the job.

interview. A meeting between an employer and a job applicant.

letter of application. A letter that accompanies your résumé expressing interest in a position and providing more information about your qualifications.

letter of recommendation. A document written by one of your references you can show to any prospective employer testifying to your abilities.

networking. Making contacts with people who may be able to help you find a job.

part-time job. A job that is fewer than 40 hours per week.

portfolio. An organized collection of your work showcasing your talents and skills.

professional organizations. Recognized associations that unite and inform people who work in the same occupation or industry.

references. People who know you and your work habits well, but are not relatives.

résumé. A short history of your education, qualifications, and work experience.
