Chapter 22: Clothing Choices—Read, Discuss, and Analyze Activity

New and Old Clothing

READ the case study

The new school year is starting in three weeks. Over the summer, Nate has recreated and developed his own sense of personal style. His new style differs from the style of clothing he was wearing during the last school year. While examining his wardrobe, Nate realizes that most of his garments are fads. Some items still physically fit, but some items are too small. He is planning on shopping to replace his entire wardrobe for better fitting, stylish clothing.
