Exercise 7-5

- 1. Continue from Exercise 7-4 or start AutoCAD.
- 2. Start a new drawing from scratch or use a template of your choice. Save the drawing as EX7-5.
- 3. Disable running object snaps.
- 4. Draw a horizontal line and a circle above the line. Begin a new line at the center of the circle and end it perpendicular to the first line using the Center and Perpendicular object snap overrides.
- Draw two intersecting lines and a separate circle. Add a line from the center of the circle to the intersection of the lines using the **Center** and **Intersection** object snap overrides.
- Activate running object snaps, set the Center, Perpendicular, and Intersection
 running object snap modes, and recreate the same objects using running object
 snaps.
- 7. Disable running object snaps.
- 8. Draw two nonintersecting, nonparallel lines. Draw a line from the endpoint of one line to the point where it would intersect the other line if it were extended. Use the Endpoint and Extension or Extended Intersection object snap overrides to complete this step.
- 9. Resave and close the file.
- 10. Keep AutoCAD open for the next exercise, or exit AutoCAD if necessary.
